**A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING PUBLIC POWER WEEK, OCT. 4-10, 2020:
A WEEK-LONG CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 2 OF PACIFIC
COUNTY'S YEAR-ROUND SERVICE TO PACIFIC COUNTY**

WHEREAS, the citizens of Pacific County, place high value on local control over community services and therefore have chosen to operate a community-owned, not-for-profit electric utility and, as customers and owners of our electric utility, have a direct say in utility operations and policies; and

WHEREAS, Public Utility District No. 2 of Pacific County is a dependable and trustworthy institution whose local operation provides many consumer protections and continues to make our community a better place to live and work, and contributes to protecting the global environment.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that Public Utility District No. 2 of Pacific County will continue to provide responsive, reliable and professional service at the lowest cost to our customer-owners just as it has since 1940, the year public power first flowed to the citizens of Pacific County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the week of Oct. 4-10, 2020 be designated Public Power Week to recognize Public Utility District No. 2 of Pacific County for its contributions to the community and to educate customer-owners, policy makers, and employees on the benefits of public power; and


