I-732 and How it Affects Your PUD

I-732 is an initiative to the Legislature that would impose a tax on carbon emissions from the generation of electricity used by consumers in Washington State. The intent of this tax is to fund a 1% reduction in the state sales tax, a reduction in the B&O tax on manufacturing, and provide funding for the working families sales tax exemption. The Legislature did not act on the initiative so it will be placed on the ballot for the November 2016 state general election. The information provided herein is specific to the potential effects of I-732 on the impact and costs to our Utility operations and our customers and does not address any other parts of the initiative.

The initiative would affect Public Utility District No. 2 of Pacific County, by applying the carbon tax to certain resources used to serve customers. The tax would start in 2017 at \$15 per ton of carbon emissions, rise to \$25 in 2018, and increase by 3.5% plus inflation annually until it reaches \$100 per ton in 2016 dollars.

If I-732 were adopted, it would **increase the cost** that customers of P.U.D. No. 2 of Pacific County pay for electricity. The District purchases nearly all of its wholesale power from the Bonneville Power Administration. A portion of this wholesale power is generated using coal which produces carbon emissions and hence would be taxed under I-732. A cost projection for this tax liability was performed by the Washington PUD Association based on Washington Administrative Code and testimony by Carbon WA, supporters of the initiative.

This analysis projects the cost of wholesale power for the District, for the July 1, 2017-June 30, 2018 period, would **increase by** \$257,644-\$858,813. For the July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 period the increase would be between \$429,407-\$1,431,355 and grow from there to a projected increase for the 2025-2026 period of \$592,084-\$1,973,614.

Downed Wire Dangers and How to Stay Safe

A downed power line may not be a dead line.

It could cause serious injury or death.

Assume all power lines are energized and dangerous. Lines that are de-energized could become energized at any time. Never touch a downed power line— and never touch a person or object that is touching a power line. Follow these safety tips to stay safe around a downed power line:

- ⇒ Immediately report a downed power line to a PUD office (or after hours number) and call 911.
- ⇒ If you see someone who has been shocked and is in direct or indirect contact with a downed power line, do not touch the person. Efforts to pull an electric shock victim away could make you a second victim. Warn others to stay away.
- ⇒ If a power line falls across or near your vehicle while you are in it, stay inside until help arrives. If you must exit, jump completely clear, making sure that you don't touch the vehicle and the ground at the same time. Land with both feet together and shuffle or hop at least 30 feet away from the vehicle.
- ⇒ Do not try to move tree limbs that are on or near a power line.
